What is an Auditor and How to Promote God

Organization: Authentic love for God is the key to everything in the world.
Faith brings you God's support.
God cares for your soul as well as about your welfare.
Honesty is the essential measurement in God's eyes.

Audience analysis: The audience includes different age groups and social layers as it concerns the family members.

Topic: Modern professions demand too much from a person very often. Only sincere faith can help overcome any obstacle and make the world more picturesque.

Rhetorical Purpose: To inform my audience about the prospects of God's promotion in terms of Auditor's world.

Redemptive Purpose: To inform my audience how Auditor's vocation can serve as a platform for promoting the following: God's rightful authority over all things, the truth, human life as well as any other form of life on the Earth, justice and mercy, honesty and self-control, church and personal property rights, our love and true compassion to other people. As the apostle Paul proclaimed to the Colossians in his instructive word, "...whatever you do or say, do it as a representative of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father..." (3:16-17).

Introduction:

I. Attention-getter

Less than tomorrow and still more than yesterday...

II. Motive for Listening

Our life is full of miracles and new opportunities, though often we do not even notice them, and they wistfully leave our days for good... I ask you to stop this unbelievable ignorance. Open your heart for every new miracle that God gives to you. The life itself is a marvelous gift and the proof of God's boundless and eternal love for every human being on the Earth. It is quite simple: just to follow his guidelines and promote not only our own trust, but also help other people realize this wise truth.

III. Credibility Statement

I am a student and I have just started to deal with this topic recently. And now I am sure that I have discovered so much that it is my obligation to share it with you!

IV. Purpose or Thesis Statement

My purpose is to present the inevitable connections between any aspect of human life and God.

V. Preview Statement

I want to emphasize the following crucial aspects in my speech: how to promote authentic love, faith, defense of welfare and honesty in the process of accountant's or auditor's professional activity.

Body:

I. Main Point 1. Everything you do should be done exclusively on the behalf of authentic love for God – otherwise nothing, even successfully performed, will ever indeed matter.

A. Bright and persuasive example can be observed in Micah's words: "...to do what is right, to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God..." (6:8). This quotation shows the proper way to serve God, and it is impossible without the authentic love for Him.

B. The work of the auditor account is based on serving the purposes of others. It is impossible to serve people in a proper way without love for human beings as God teaches us: "Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans, 12:10). Still it is impossible to love others without authentic love for God as only this love teaches us to truly promote the values God appreciates and gives us the right to make this promotion. As Varney (2012) emphasizes, a person should love what God loves as a human being has been created in His own image.

II. Main Point 2. Promote your faith in God with every step you take, with every breath you make.

A. "By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks" (Hebrews, 11).

B. Every accountant is supposed to have strong faith in God to realize that he or she is doing right things; to be sure that God leads him or her in the right

direction and have no doubts in His love. Though, doubts may still appear, but everyone sins on the Earth – that is why we need the redemption. “Every sin on the debit side of the ledger demands death and wrath on the credit side of the ledger” (Lee, 2005, p. 1). Only true faith and authentic love will make the redemption possible.

C. “And he believed the Lord, and he counted it to him as righteousness” (Genesis, 15:6).

III. Main Point 3. God considers personal property rights to be of great value and consideration.

A. “You shall not steal” (Exodus, 20:15).

B. “He said to him, “Which ones?” And Jesus said, “You shall not murder, You shall not commit adultery, You shall not steal, You shall not bear false witness” (Matthew, 19:18).

C. “Accountants and auditors help to ensure that firms are run efficiently, public records kept accurately, and taxes paid properly and on time” (Alban, 2012, p. 358). The very essence of the accountant’s job is already a vivid illustration of the appropriate promotion of the values that are of primary importance for God. They are here to guard and to account; it may be even stated as there was a great amount of diverse assets that God entrusted to the human beings. Besides, they have the profit of their own – as the result of dealing with some assets that God initially gave to them. In 2008 it amounted to \$ 59,430 as an annual category (Alban, 2012, p. 364). Thus, accountants may even to some extent be regarded as direct representatives of God Himself.

D. As Meerman observes, everyone knows well enough that we are

ultimately accountable to God. This is the eternal truth and it allows us even to consider God in the role of the Major Accountant (Lee, 2005, p. 1).

IV. Main Point 4. Be honest and promote God in such a way in the whole world around you.

A. “You shall not oppress your neighbor or rob him. The wages of a hired worker shall not remain with you all night until the morning” (Leviticus, 19:13). Honesty is significantly important in the accountant’s occupation as it is the basis of his or her personality, as well as in his or her professional career. Besides, the job outlook predicts fast growth of opportunities for certified accountants (it is necessary to have a bachelor’s degree at least, while the master’s degree with the working experience in the field of accounting is much preferable, as well as certification or other kinds of designation). That is the point where honesty and fairness will be of primary consideration. Moreover, job conditions require spending their working time in the standard office setting, so they are to deal with other people, colleagues and clients. And this is the great measurement of the level of honesty and impartiality.

B. Luke compared the level of honesty of a person in the following wise way: if a man is trusted with small things and is honest and fair, then this man should also be trusted with big things – he will be honest dealing with them as well. But if a man appears to be dishonest in little things, then he will be dishonest in big things, too. If a person cannot be trusted with worldly riches, emphasizes Luke, then this person will not be trusted with the heavenly riches in the future eternal life (Luke, 16:10-11). This rule may be successfully applied to the occupation of the accountant as it concerns all the essential aspects of his or her job and being a true and responsible Christian as well.

Conclusion:

I. Summary

The key aspects to promote God working in the accounting sphere are as follows: love for God, profound faith and hope for God's support, defense of welfare, honesty and impartiality in your everyday life. These aspects will help a person not only in the course of professional activity, but also will improve a person as an individual and as a religious Christian.

II. Refocus Audience Attention

To be good and faithful Christian means to be consistent in every situation, under any circumstances – either in the professional field, or in private and family affair, or in social setting. Stay a good Christian, follow and promote the most essential values that God appreciates – less than tomorrow, more than yesterday ...
